Today at Muhlenberg

Wonderful Counselor Series



From way back in Isaiah 9, the Messiah is proclaimed to be a *"Wonderful Counselor,"* but even Jesus knows that He's not trying to replace the valuable work of

mental health professionals! Mental health can be such a tricky subject to discuss, and even more so in the life of the church. Where is God in the midst of a mental health crisis? Does my depression mean that I lack faith and selfcontrol? Am I a bad Christian if I go to therapy?

We'll explore these questions and more throughout our *Wonderful Counselor* series, and create space to reflect deeply as a community on how we understand mental health and build a culture that promotes healing and understanding within our community. Our four-week lectionary will approach the following themes:

• Week 1 (6/23): Romans 8:5-11, 26-28; Set Your Minds on Things of the Spirit This foundational conversation for the series explores how mental health is about more than "self-control," even as we discuss that as a facet of faith. God's grace and spirit intervene, sometimes in the form of mental health professionals.

- Week 2 (TODAY, 6/30): Psalm 139:7-14; More than Diagnoses... Fearfully and Wonderfully Made What if we framed conversations around mental health by seeing people as beloved children of God before seeing them as a condition?
- Week 3 (7/7): Psalm 23; **The Darkest Valley** We discuss depression, anxiety, despair, and disorder in light of a God who comforts and does not abandon.
- Week 4 (7/14): Luke 8:26-39; **Return to Your Home** Our concluding conversation explores the role of community in caring for one another through the ups and downs of mental health, and how we as a church might embody that care.

Jesus is a Wonderful Counselor, but He's not a licensed therapist... Join us for a series exploring the intersections of faith in Christ, the blessing of a compassionate community, and the reality of mental health.

TODAY AT MUHLENBERG (CONT'D)

Wonderful Counselor Resource for Week 2: ELCA Social Message

Each week of our series, we'll offer resources and opportunities for deeper engagement with our themes. As we consider what it means to be *More than Diagnoses... Fearfully and Wonderfully Made*, we are encouraged to see people as beloved children of God





rather than seeing them only as a condition. For deeper reflection on this topic from a faithful perspective, we encourage you to check out "*The Body of Christ and Mental Illness*", an ELCA Social Message from 2012 that seeks to raise awareness of the challenges of mental illness, offer reflection and direction, and inspire action. This social message notes how mental illness makes the most basic aspects of everyday life daunting and sketches some of the challenges. These include the challenges to human dignity and difficulties in gaining access to treatment, problems that worsen existing social inequalities and lapses in the U.S. healthcare system.

The message puts to rest the notion that mental illness is an indicator of special sin in the family or the person suffering from it. It emphasizes the church's role in encouraging companionship and healing via restoration of relationships, heeding Galatians 6:2. What people with mental illness most need is time to pursue and engage in treatment and to maintain or create relationships where they can exercise their abilities. Throughout the many forms of ministry the church provides, the church is called to confront practices that do not uphold human dignity and to offer hope and companionship, and attend to its own practices around health, its public voice, and the sensitive and thoughtful preparation of church leaders. Today we remember the ministry of Pastor Robert W. Chell, who was Campus Pastor for Muhlenberg 1987 - 1993. Some of you may have had the pleasure to greet Bob and his family when they worshipped

with us in May 2022 while on vacation. Although he couldn't be with us this summer, Pastor Chell, who lives in South Dakota, sent a delightful letter in response to our invitation. Here is an excerpt from his response:

"As I read your letter so many warm memories came flooding back, both of congregation members and the colleagues and staff I was privileged to work with. We were so glad to visit in May 2022 and remember the warm hospitality with which you greeted us then.

I served South Dakota State University for 20 years after leaving Muhlenberg and concluded my ministry at St. Dysmas, a Lutheran congregation behind the walls of SD State Penitentiary. In retirement I've served as a mentor to rural pastors and do home visits for a large congregation here in Sioux Falls.

... Let the Apostle Paul's greeting in his letter to the Philippians be my heartfelt conclusion to this brief letter. 'I thank my God for every remembrance of you, always in every one of my prayers for all of you, praying with joy for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now.'

Carole and I cherish our warm memories of our years with you. May God continue to bless your vibrant congregation."

AA is a fellowship of people who work together to stay sober and carry their message to other alcoholics. They are self-supporting and do not accept outside contributions.

CREATION CARE

Make a few eco-friendly changes to keep mosquitoes at bay. You don't need a bug zapper or harsh



chemicals to control mosquitoes. Standing water in your yard is a breeding ground for mosquitoes. Drill holes in the bottom of your plant pots, recycling bins, and trashcans. Be sure to replace the water in birdbaths, water fountains, and pet bowls regularly to prevent mosquitoes from laying eggs.


NOTE FROM OUR TREASURER
